











CYCLE SECURITY

- If leaving your bicycle locked up overnight, avoid dimly-lit or isolated places. Where possible, lock it up in a well-lit area, such as under a street light.
- Don't forget to make sure you've secured removable parts and taken any accessories with you.
- Use two different types of lock, such as a D-lock and a sturdy chain lock. A thief will need different tools to break each lock, making theft less likely.
- A second lock is also useful to secure removable parts, such as the wheel, to the frame.

Advice from Essex Police regarding the safe keeping of your bicycle or other velocipedes

- Register your bicycle at immobilise.com.

 It's free and can increase your chances of recovering your stolen bike.
- Take a clear photo of your bicycle and make a record of its description, including serial numbers and any unique features.
- If possible add an additional security
 mark or tag to your bike to identify it as
