Essex Pedal Power, a flagship programme of our LDP, has been shortlisted for most innovative project at the UK Active Awards.

Furthermore, Jason Fergus has been shortlisted for Outstanding Leadership, and Dr William Bird, adviser to our LDP since its inception, and Chairman of Active Essex has been shortlisted for lifetime recognition at UK Active Awards.

ANOTHER HUGE NATIONAL LOTTERY COMMUNITY FUND GRANT FOR ACTIVE ESSEX FOUNDATION CHARITY

Following the LDP decision to invest £75,000 into an innovative new youth sport and mental health project, this was backed up last week with an incredible grant of £496,929 from the National Lottery Community Fund.

The funding will launch a first of its kind 3-year mental health project in the country, using sport to tackle poor mental health in young people, delivered through a network of 16 Locally Trusted Organisations (LTOs).

The youth mental health project builds on the youth crime prevention project which is also run by the Active Essex Foundation in partnership with LTOs, and also received funding from LDP and NLCF. The new youth mental health project will engage over 2,000 young people and will be delivered with specialist mental health partners Centre for Mental Health, Believe Perform, and StreetGames. Here are some recent stories from Tendring demonstrating how Essex Pedal Power and Wheels for All are working together to support residents to get cycling.

Billie was signed up to receive a bike from Essex Pedal Power but was not sure if a bicycle or tricycle was the right choice. Wheels for All provided a tricycle to try at the EPP giveaway event. After trying both it became clear, that with a little practice, a bicycle would be the right choice for Billie. Another happy Essex Pedal Power bike recipient!

Janet came to pick up an Essex Pedal Power bike, but she had not cycled for many years. Due to a long-term health condition, Janet did not feel confident riding the bicycle, so the on-hand Bikeability instructor suggested trying a tricycle instead. This was more successful but returning to the roads was still too daunting a prospect. Observing this, the Wheels for All project officer suggested Janet join one of the Wheels for All cycling sessions at Shorefields School. Wheels for All have a variety of adaptive cycles and were able to find just the right tricycle, allowing Janet to cycle her first 45 minute ride in many years.
