ESSEX PEDAL POWER 'FAMILY' MEET TO CELEBRATE A HUGELY SUCCESSFUL 2023

The Essex Pedal Power 'family', which now delivers across 5 places in Essex, met in Colchester last week to reflect on 2023 and plan for 2024. The networking event, led by Sylvia Gentleman and Julian Sanchez, was attended by over 30 people from over 10 organisations that work so well as a team to deliver Essex Pedal Power.

Essex Pedal Power has now impacted the lives of over 1,500 people through the gifting of a brand new bike and ongoing support and encouragement in the disadvantaged communities of 1) Clacton and Jaywick, 2) Harwich and Dovercourt, 3) Colchester, 4) Basildon, 5) Canvey Island. There are 2,500 more bikes to give away in 2024, with plans to also take Essex Pedal Power to Harlow and Thurrock. The event was a huge success, with people enjoying the Christmas and cycling theme.





JASON AND KERRY SELECTED TO BE IN FIRST COHORT OF TUTORS TO DELIVER THE NEW SPORT ENGLAND PLACE EXPANSION LEADERSHIP COURSE

Jason and Kerry attended a 3-day course at Loughborough last week to be trained in delivering the new Sport England Place Expansion Leadership course.

Nineteen people were chosen from across the 12 LDPs and other Sport England Place partners to be the first cohort to deliver the new courses and were trained by Martyn Allison and Ken Masser, who designed the 2-day course, and who successfully tested the course in Blackpool and Wirral over the summer. Andy Wright, former Chief Executive of Braintree District Council, and Karen Creavin, Chief Executive of The Active Wellbeing Society, were also chosen to be in the first cohort of new tutors.

The new 2-day leadership course will initially be delivered in the new Sport England Place Expansion communities during 2024. The purpose of the course is to create or expand a network that is driving system change in a place to tackle high levels of physical inactivity, tackle the worst inequalities, and encourage children to have a positive attitude to sport and physical activity.


NEW SWIMMING POOL AT EVERSLEY LEISURE POOL

Recently we cut the ribbon to the multi-million pound swimming pool as an extension to Eversley Leisure Centre in Pitsea.

The brand-new facilities include a four-lane 25-metre pool, dedicated changing facilities and an extension to the existing car park, providing 50 additional parking spaces for those using the centre.

COLCHESTER UPDATE

RELATIONSHIP GROWS BETWEEN COMMUNITY 360 AND THE UNIVERSITY OF ESSEX

Following the recent launch of a case study on the partnership working between Community360 and the University of Essex. We continue to build on a collaborative relationship with the University of Essex, linking with the SRES team on a variety of projects to help bring physical activity to communities around Colchester. Recently, the second-year physiotherapy cohort designed, as part of their course, a home workout programme to go out with the Winter Packs we are distributing as part of our Winter Resilience project (photo attached). We have also met with Dr Chris McManus as we look to organise more sporting opportunities for refugees situated in Colchester to help with their mental health and wellbeing.

In addition we will soon be meeting with Dr Mike Rogerson to discuss opportunities for the use of VR headsets and hand cycles in care homes to measure the impact on health and wellbeing of residents. Meanwhile Dr Andrew Brinkley and Abi Onuoha, along with some of their students, are looking to come on board to our previously mentioned Waiting Well project launching in the New Year.
