### SPORT ENGLAND PLACE PARTNERSHIPS EXPANSION IN ESSEX

2024 is a very important year for Sport England as they roll out their £250m Place Partnerships expansion. In Essex, a key aspect of the Sport England Place Partnerships expansion is the deepening of our LDP work. This means that there will be new funds to sustain and scale up the most successful elements of our LDP testing in Basildon, Colchester, and Tendring, but also to sustain the LDP system change work at an Essex-wide level.

Two workshops have been set up at the end of January to start co-designing the priorities for LDP deepening in Basildon and North Essex (Colchester and Tendring). Active Essex will play a leadership role alongside Sport England to use the learnings from our LDP to start up Place Partnerships work in new places in Essex that meet the Sport England criteria for deprivation, physical inactivity, and social need.

### NEW SPORT ENGLAND PUBLICATION ON 'NAVIGATING LOCAL SYSTEMS'

### ESSEX PEDAL POWER

Essex Pedal Power went from strength to strength in 2023, expanding into four new places: Harwich, Colchester, Basildon, and Canvey Island.

Essex Pedal Power is already well established in Clacton and Jaywick, and is fast approaching the amazing target of 1000 bikes distributed to eligible residents in the most deprived areas. The Essex Pedal Power family has committed to distributing all bikes in 2024 and this is a huge undertaking – nearly 2,500 new bikes to be given out across our 5 places. This will mean that approximately 4,000 people will be cycling in our most disadvantaged communities who otherwise would not have been cycling. This will create a massive shift in the demographics of our cycling community in Essex.

## BAR 'N' BUS MOBILE DROP-IN SPACE IN LAINDON

Bar 'n' Bus started working in Laindon in 2020, providing a detached youth work programme which saw youth workers on foot engaging with young people gathering in public spaces. Youth Workers built supportive relationships with groups they met and, as necessary, young people were linked with positive activities, group work programmes and in-school support.

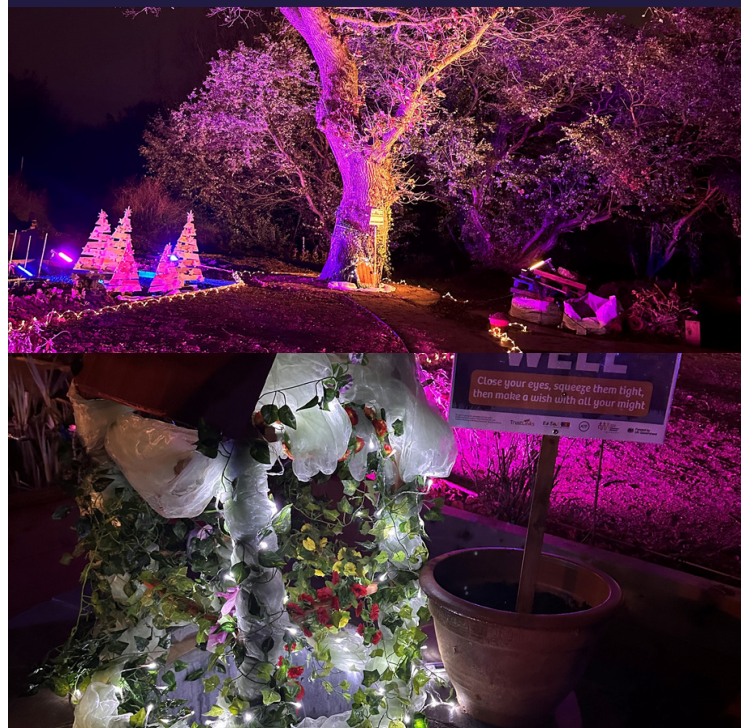
In 2022 Bar 'n' Bus received funding for a brand-new mobile youth vehicle to use as an outreach space for young people. Leading on from the detached team's work, the bus deploys in Laindon each week for young people as a afterschool space offering a warm drink, a place to chat and a range of fun activities. The project has grown throughout 2023, with a regular group of young people engaging who the team see on the bus, in the school and through other youth work programmes to offer a wide variety of supportive and inspirational engagements throughout the week.



## TRUSTLINKS VANGE ENCHANTED GARDEN

On the 7th December, TrustLinks Vange hosted an Enchanted Garden Event which was co-produced with the organisations involved in Volunteer Futures. The event featured Christmas lights, music, workshops, and food, all free of charge to the community and was enjoyed by all.

In addition, as from the 20th November, the TrustLinks Garden in Vange has opened 2 days a week. This second day is for new members, to increase the number of people they are able to reach via the service.

## ESSEX PEDAL POWER PROVIDES JOB OPPURTUNITY FOR BIKE RECIPIENT

## BEAT THE STREET TO RETURN TO HARWICH AND DOVERCOURT

New funding from the LDP and Essex County Council Public Health Accelerator Bid fund means that Beat the Street will take place for six weeks in Harwich and Dovercourt between March 13th and April 24th. The game will be managed by CVS Tendring in partnership with Intelligent Health, Active Essex, and Tendring District Council. The game is expected to attract over 2,000 players out of a total population of 18,500, all competing in teams to tap as many of the 40 Beat the Street boxes as many times as they can.
