- Spaces to share skills across organisations, groups or individuals.

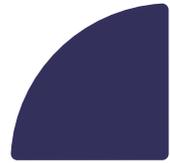


Capacity building and governance

Communications, visibility and signposting

- Social media training tailored to small or grassroots groups
- Website improvement support or digital profile building
- Skills that help capture and share impact e.g. storytelling or video workshops.



Volunteer development and recognition

- Training and peer support for volunteer managers or coordinators
- Development of shared volunteer onboarding resources or packs
- Networking opportunities for volunteers to connect and learn.



Capacity building and governance

Workshops, training and learning opportunities for:

- Diversifying income (advanced bid writing, corporate partnerships, trading, fundraising)
- Governance, legal responsibilities and leadership
- Organisational health checks to identify strengths and needs
- Support with policy and development, safeguarding and finance systems
- Practical training in impact measurement, monitoring and evaluation
- Help for new or emerging groups to formalise structure and operations.



Community engagement and listening

- Training in co-production and community outreach
- Facilitation of lived experience groups to shape local priorities
- Resources to collate and share learning across the VCS sector.

Strengthen collaboration and peer support

VCS organisations value existing networks but want more informal networking and skill-sharing opportunities. Activities could include:

- Create informal networking events for VCSOs to connect
- Facilitate peer support forums for those in similar roles
- Support development of a skills-sharing opportunities/initiatives.



Support fundraising and sustainability

Core funding and sustainability and major concerns for VCSOs. Activities could include:

- Providing training on fundraising strategies and bid writing for grassroots VCSOs
- Clinics/events for connecting VCSOs to grant makers.



Boost communication, PR and community engagement

Many VCSOs struggle with visibility, reaching target audiences and demonstrating impact. Activities could include:

- Deliver training opportunities for developing effective communications strategy and understanding the use of AI
- Explore the needs of VCSOs further on which evaluation and/or demonstrating impact support would be more suitable.



Support volunteer and workforce resilience

Volunteer burnout and retention challenges are limiting delivery. Activities could include:

- Initiatives that support staff/volunteer retention and reduce management burnout
- Subsidised inclusive training offers for VCSOs (e.g. EDI, mental health first aid).

Strengthen core capacity and leadership

Many organisations are stuck in reactive delivery cycles and lack time/resources for strategic planning. Activities could include:

- Leadership upskilling (e.g. strategic planning, change management)
- Trustee development and governance support
- Business planning and income diversification.



Enhance collaboration and networking

Duplication and fragmentation are issues, smaller groups are becoming disconnected. Activities could include:

- Facilitation or peer networks or community impact forums
- Cross-sector partnership events (e.g. with statutory services)
- Knowledge-sharing platforms or events.



Support workforce and volunteer development

Recruitment and retention of staff/volunteers is a major challenge. Activities could include:

- Volunteer experience design and retention strategies
- People management training for leaders
- Matchmaking, shared resources or peer mentoring pilots.



Improve access to training, learning and development

Training is valued but often unaffordable or inaccessible. So activities could include:

- Subsidised access to essential training from local need
- Shared training sessions across organisations
- Spaces to share skills across organisations, groups or individuals.

- Provide 1:1 support for funding applications
- Re-establish 'Meet the Funder' sessions and a funding newsletter.



Volunteer recruitment and retention

- Run a Maldon-specific volunteering workshop
- Promote cross-volunteering opportunities between organisations
- Support with volunteer management and matchmaking.



Networking and collaboration

- Align and strengthen existing forums (e.g. Maldon CVS, Livewell)
- Create informal peer support spaces
- Encourage joint funding applications and shared learning.



Marketing, comms and community engagement

- Deliver marketing and communications workshops
- Support organisations to reach underrepresented communities
- Help raise awareness of services and increase referrals.

Networking, collaboration and peer support

Opportunities for collaboration, networking and partnership working, which could include:

- Facilitation for VCS organisations to come together, network and share
- Thematic networking opportunities (e.g. specific community needs in Rochford)
- Peer learning on key issues and topics
- VCS Leadership forums and representation
- VCS voice, facilitation of lived experience groups to shape local services
- Further listening opportunities and insight gathering of local VCS sector needs.

Strengthen collaboration and partnership effectiveness

There's a strong appetite for collaboration, with opportunities to develop sharing resources, skills and creating partnerships wanted. Activities could include:

- Mapping purpose of existing networks and developing
- Peer-to-peer mentoring or partnership-building pilots
- Explore opportunities for groups to share resources and skillset's.



Improve access to training and workforce development

Training is valued, but often inaccessible due to cost or availability. Many organisations highlighted a need to support people management, leadership and volunteers. So, activities could include:

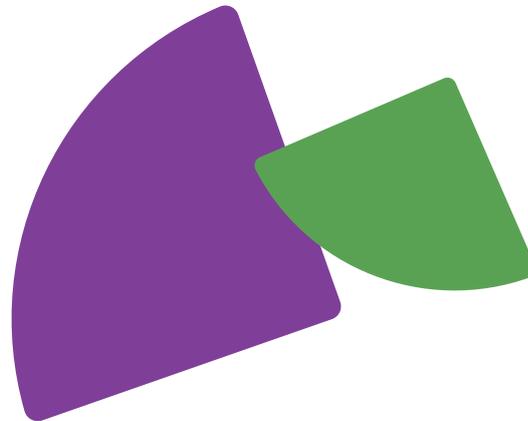
- Subsidised access to essential training (e.g. safeguarding, digital skills, EDI, AI)
- Leadership and people management development
- Volunteer recruitment and experience design.



Support strategic planning and organisational development

Many organisations want to plan for the future but may not recognise or articulate their development needs. So, activities could include:

- Workshops or 1:1 support on business planning, governance, or leadership
- Tools or consultancy to help organisations reflect on their development needs
- Trustee recruitment and board development support.
